<sup>[1]</sup> The list of housing quality concerns has been adapted from questions in the Family Options Study and the Fragile Families Study. In these surveys, each concern is listed as a separate question, which is why they had to be adapted. HUD has developed a standard housing quality index from the American Housing Survey, known as the <u>PQI, poor quality index</u>. However, it consists of a total of 35 detailed questions that are all assigned different weights. The concerns listed in question A4 are all weighted highly in the PQI and address the major definitional components within the literature on housing quality. These include concerns that can cause health problems or represent major structural deficiencies.
