

# Child Abuse in Arizona (6 month period)1

- Child Abuse Hotline received 21,317 calls that met the statutory criteria for a DCS report.
- Number of children in out-of-home care decreased from 12,546 to 11,696.
- Majority of children in out-of-home care are from ages 1 to 5 years (4,596 or 39.3%)
- Ethnicity majority of children in out-of-home care are Hispanic (34.2%) & Caucasian (31.8%)
- African American children represent 5.2% of population yet 17.4% are in out-of-home care.
- Children with an adoption case plan spend on average 25 months in out-of-home care.
- 30% of children leaving foster care spent over 12 month in care.
- Average number of placements was 2.7.







# Reason for Children in Care in Arizona





# Length of Time in Out of Home Care in Arizona





#### Child Deaths in Arizona

"In 2021, 863 children under 18 years of age died in Arizona. This is an  $\,$  increase from 2020 when 838children died."  $_1$ 

- 176 child deaths involved drugs/alcohol
- 206 children died as a result of prematurity
- 128 children died as a result of abuse/neglect
- 72 children died while in motor vehicle crash
- 65 babies died in unsafe sleep environments
- 47 children were victims of homicide
- 44 children took their own lives
- 44 children died by drowning56 children died by firearms
