There are 13 states that do not guarantee lawyers for children in abuse and neglect proceedings. An intern in this role will write policy briefs, memorandums, fact sheets and lobbying communications to educate and influence legislators and other key stakeholders on the role of an attorney for children, the impact of children's legal representation, the research on improved outcomes, opportunities for Title IV-E funding, and the various factors supporting high-quality legal representation. The intern will create and co-present presentations on the importance of Counsel for Kids to stakeholders, government agencies, and legislators considering reform. During the summer, coalitions around the country prepare for their upcoming legislative sessions. Much policy advocacy happens outside of the legislative session (usually in January - April). The intern will have extensive opportunity to prepare talking points and testimony</p>

	<p>for advocates and to work with legislators and staffers, ombudsmen, child welfare agencies, the judiciary to develop policy framework proposals that suits their needs. Through this exposure the intern will learn about policy development systems, legal services infrastructure, funding, and human resource concerns that govern policy changes in the child welfare space. All work can be done remotely.
